Texas Southern University is Launching the only Health Physics Program in Houston

The Physics Department at Texas Southern University (TSU) is launching an honors-level Health Physics program for Fall 2008. Funded through a grant from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, it will be the only health physics program in Houston. This physics-based program will grant a Professional BS degree in health physics with an emphasis in environmental health physics. Specialization courses in medical health physics, pre-medical physics, and

nuclear engineering will be available. The program is a comprehensive curriculum (nearly graduate level) and combines fundamental nuclear physics education with very practical skills that include courses like basic concepts of atomic and radiation physics, environmental radioactivity, introduction to nuclear physics, radiation detection, nuclear radiation detection laboratory, radiation protection, and dosimetry. Courses in radiochemistry and radiology emergency management

NRC Announces \$15 Million in Nuclear Education Grant Opportunities

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) has announced nuclear education grant opportunities for trade school scholarships, undergraduate scholarships, graduate fellowships, and faculty development to qualified academic institutions for FY 2008.

Congress authorized the agency to provide \$15 million in grants to support education in nuclear science, technology, and engineering to develop a workforce capable of supporting the design, construction and operation, and regulation of commercial nuclear facilities, and handling nuclear materials safely.

“Congress realizes that the United States is experiencing a renewed inter-

est in nuclear power,” said Chairman Klein. “The NRC has already received several applications for new reactors. To meet expected workforce needs in this regard, it is vital that the country provide opportunities that will encourage careers and research in nuclear engineering and related fields.”

The nuclear education opportunity for grants is currently available on www.grants.gov, the central storehouse for information on federally funded grant programs. NRC’s Nuclear Education Grants provide funding for undergraduate scholarships, graduate fellowships, trade school scholarships, and faculty development grants. The

exact amount of funds that NRC may recommend for grants is determined in pre-award negotiations between the applicant and the agency. NRC only awards grants directly to accredited U.S. institutions of higher education and does not award individual scholarships or fellowships.

Pete Myers Retires...Again

Effective January 1, 2008, retired United States Army Colonel Peter H. Myers (MS from TAMU) retired a second time from service to the people of this great land of ours. Of course, the second retirement I speak of is Pete's departure from the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS), where he spent twelve years tirelessly preserving the radiological health of the citizens of the great state of Texas since May 1995. Here, Pete served as Chief of the Medical and Academic Licensing Program, TDH; the Deputy Director of Licensing, TDH; and Manager, Radioactive Material Licensing, DSHS.

Before the DSHS, Pete was with the U.S. Army with his last stint at the Pentagon, as Radiological Hygiene Consultant to The Surgeon General, where he developed, evaluated, and initiated radiation safety policies for the U.S. Army. Other U.S. Army positions held by Col. Myers included Chief, Health Physics Office and RSO, at prestigious Walter Reed Army Medical Center and Commander, U.S. Army Pacific Environmental Health Engineering Agency, Japan. Before that was his first stretch at the Pentagon as Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical Medical Defense Staff Officer and Assistant RPO for the Enewetak Atoll Cleanup Project.



Before this, Pete flew UH-1 helicopters into harm's way saving countless lives of American men fighting to preserve freedom in Southeast Asia.

With the state, peers, subordinates, and licensees alike greatly benefitted from Pete's sensibility, dedication, and steady-handed approach to regulation and his work ethic. Because of his engrained internal clock, much of each day's "busy work" had been completed before most employees arrived at work for the day because Pete would often rise early and be busy at work in his office by 3:00 a.m., and he would almost never leave the office before 4:30 p.m.

Pete is a member of national Health Physics Society (HPS), close to 30 years now, and a very ACTIVE South Texas Chapter (STC) member since 1995. Pete has participated in many activities of the STC starting with teaching portions of the Science Teacher Workshops, while serving on the Executive Council as Board Member, Public Relations Committee Co-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer-Elect, and now Treasurer for a second time. His national HPS duties included serving on the Programs and Venues Committees at the same time, then serving on the Symposia Committee.

Pete's good nature, and that of his adorable bride of 36.7 years, Karen, have become very much of a welcome sight at our Chapter meetings, as he ends a second run at STC Treasurer. Evidently, that will continue. With Karen's help, part of Pete's retirement

will also be introduced into the curriculum once additional funding is approved. This addition will involve collaboration with the University of Texas at Austin. Radiation biology and nuclear engineering courses (on-line at UT Austin) will be presented optionally. The program website (still under development) is: <http://physics.tsu.edu/Academics/BSHealth.php>

The radiation detection laboratory is planned as the core learning facility and will be conducted over 3 semesters. It presently covers GM counters, proportional counters, scintillation detectors, health physics applications, alpha and gamma spectroscopy, and a basic nuclear electronics lab (with NIM modules). Expanding this laboratory and introducing a radiochemistry and a radiation emergency laboratory are included in the next stage.

Presently, the program is supported by three faculty members: Dr. Mark Harvey, a PhD in high-energy physics and a former MD Anderson post-doctoral research fellow in medical physics; Mr. Boris Tsenov, with an MS degree in nuclear engineering with working experience in health physics, and me, Dr. Elena Stefanova, a PhD in nuclear physics, who

has led the development and implementation of the program. The new Physics Department at TSU is intensely focused on improving and expanding the quality of its program. It has been led, since 2005, by Dr. Carlos R. Handy, who moved from Clark Atlanta University (CAU) in Atlanta, Georgia. His area of research is convex optimization theory as applied to computational methods for quantum operators. Dr. Handy has managed to attract internationally recognized researchers such as Dr. C.J. Tymczak and Dr. Daniel Bessis. Dr. Tymczak has been recruited from the Los Alamos National Laboratory and is a recognized authority in massively parallel computing in many body physics and quantum chemistry. Prof. Bessis is a recipient of the French gold medal in theoretical physics for pioneering work in Pade approximants in field theory. He is well known for his "BMV-Conjecture" in mathematics, which is recognized as one of the top ten unsolved problems in mathematical physics. He has proposed a nonlinear noise filtering method, which may also be used to improve NMR analysis. The quality of the faculty and curriculum, as well as the growing resources, should make this program competitive with all other programs in the nation. ♦

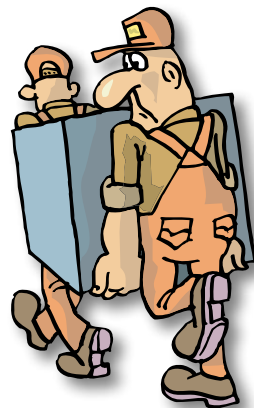
