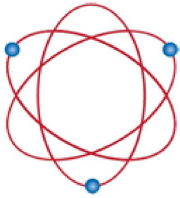

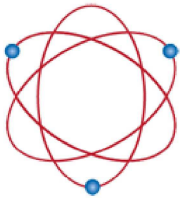
## Richard Ratliff Saluted by the Texas Radiation Advisory Board

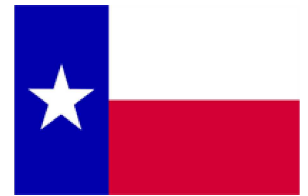




## Richard Ratliff Saluted by the Texas Radiation Advisory Board

**T**exas Radiation Advisory Board (TRAB) passed a unanimous resolution honoring Richard Allen Ratliff of Austin for his 40 years of outstanding service to Texas, regarding radiation safety. Richard is a licensed medical physicist and professional engineer. Richard began his career with the Texas Department of Health, now known as the Texas Department of State Health Services, on June 12, 1972, as a radioactive material license inspector and radiation incident investigator, shortly after receiving his master's degree in radiological health physics from the University of Oklahoma.

The TRAB was created in 1961 by the Texas Legislature and Mr. Ratliff first began attending board meetings in 1978; and was selected to serve the TRAB, as its trusted advisor on all radiation matters, when he became the Department's Radiation Control Program's Bureau Chief in 1994. Richard has ably and faithfully served the TRAB as its radiation advisor for the past eighteen (18) years, and continues to serve the Board in this capacity to this date. During his service, Mr. Ratliff has contributed, and continues to contribute, to the success of the TRAB in numerous ways, including effectively training new Board members and providing sound guidance on important and complex radiation matters coming before the TRAB.



On June 12, 2012, Richard Ratliff celebrated forty (40) years of continuous service in the field of radiation safety, particularly in the area of radiation safety and protection, to the State of Texas. The TRAB saluted and congratulated Richard Allen Ratliff, P.E., L.M.P., for the distinguished service he has provided for the past forty years, and continues to this day to provide, to the great State of Texas, and to this Board since 1994.

The resolution was unanimously passed and approved on this, the 14<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2012.

## South Texas Chapter Topical Meeting on Non-ionizing Radiation

The South Texas Chapter (STC) of the Health Physics Society (HPS) held its fall topical meeting on September 15, 2012 in Austin, Texas. The theme of the meeting was non-ionizing radiation and presentations were given by leading subject matter experts from various universities, military branches, and state government representatives.

STC President-Elect Scott (Nick) Nicholson opened the meeting by welcoming all of the attendees and gave brief announcements of upcoming chapter events including the Affiliates Fair, scheduled for January 12, 2013, in San Antonio, and the annual student meeting currently scheduled for April 20, 2013 at Texas State Technical College (TSTC), in Waco TX. He also presented scholarship checks to Vickie Hurst of TSTC and Jimmy Uhlemeyer from Texas A&M University. He personally thanked past President Karen Blanchard for her assistance in assisting with the logistical details for this meeting and Scott Pennington for his assistance in securing several speakers from the University of Texas (including himself).

The technical portion of the meeting was kicked off by our own STC executive council member and webmaster, William Pate, of the University Health System, who gave a presentation concerning lessons learned for medical laser use, citing several practical examples.

Dr. Russell Poldrack, Director, Imaging Research Center, from the University of Texas at Austin, followed with an eye-opening presentation on Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) safety Issues. A short break followed Dr. Poldrack's presentation, allowing networking opportunities.

The meeting continued after the break with two presentations by US Air Force employees. Noel Montgomery, research electrical engineer, from the Air Force Research Laboratory gave a fundamental lecture on radiofrequency safety standards. This was followed by a presentation by D. Nick Schaaf, health physicist, from the Air Force Research Laboratory, entitled *Military Training with High Power, non-FDA Compliant Laser Systems*, which again covered several practical examples.

The last speaker of the morning was John White, Radiation Safety Officer, VA North Texas Health Care System, who gave an informative, yet somewhat alarming talk on the effects of large electromagnetic fields generated by nuclear weapons and solar storms. Some of his main points included that the current forms of communication in this country are very susceptible to electromagnetic pulses from nuclear weapons explosions or even intense solar storms; especially current since solar activity will be at its cyclical peak in 2013.

Lunch was next on the agenda. Our lunch time speaker was the national HPS president-elect, Darrell Fisher. First, Dr. Fisher recognized our own Mr. Ken Krieger, CHP, for his outstanding volunteer work in organizing the Dallas mid-year meeting held in February 2012; especially since with the disbanding of the North Texas Chapter, there was no local chapter support for the meeting. He then spoke of current events happening within the Society including the politically polar issue of potentially changing the name of the Health Physics Society. He attended the meeting as part of his one-year "get to know the chapters" tour, and the STC was one of his first stops on his tour. At the conclusion of his talk, Scott Nicholson presented Dr. Fisher with the coveted STC-HPS lapel pin.

Colonel Mark Bower, Radiological Hygiene Consultant to the US Army Surgeon General and the Army's Military Health Physics Specialty Leader, kicked off the technical afternoon session with a brief talk on his experiences with non-ionizing radiation in deployed environments.

He was followed by a talk from DeWayne Holcomb, Laser Safety Manager, University of Texas at Austin, about his experiences in laser safety at laboratories at the University of Texas.

Dr. Aaron Bernstein, Assistant Director, Center for High Energy Density Physics, also from the University of Texas, gave a detailed presentation on the history of the Texas Petawatt Laser, until recently the world's highest laser power output at 1.1 Petawatt ( $10^{15}$  W).

At the conclusion of the afternoon networking break, Scott Pennington, Radiation and Laser Safety Officer, also of the University of Texas at Austin, gave a presentation detailing several laser accidents that have occurred on the UT Austin campus, and a root cause analysis for each incident.

Next up was Richard Ratliff, Manager Radiation Safety Licensing Branch, from the Department of State Health Services, who gave a brief presentation on the status of laser regulations in the state of Texas, contrasting on the differences between general use regulations and the laser hair removal regulation. His main conclusion is that the vast majority of laser hair removal operations are

being conducted under the general medical procedure regulation, because the fees and compliance issues are more economically friendly.

Wrapping up the meeting was Tracy Tipping, Reactor Health Physicist and Laboratory Manager, University of Texas at Austin, who gave practical advice on how to accomplish radiofrequency and magnetic field measurements.

Scott Nicholson concluded the meeting with closing remarks. The meeting provided attendees with a clearer picture of non-ionizing radiation issues. Darrell Fisher commented that this was one of the finest one day conferences on non-ionizing radiation that he had ever seen. The South Texas Chapter truly appreciates the efforts and participation of all the speakers, resulting in an excellent technical meeting.

Presidents Report	<p>Committee Chairs – Ad-Hoc and Appointed Committees were continued for this year. Chairs were emailed potential volunteers and asked to provide updates for this meeting.</p> <p>Chair Vacancies – The chair vacancies were filled and the updates were posted to the website by the webmaster.</p> <p>Billet Articles published in August 2012 Edition –</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Highlights from the April 2012 meeting in College Station. There are plans to also work with the publications committee chair to submit a summary article for the HPS Newsletter.</li> <li>Houston Science and Engineering Fair in March 2012</li> </ol> <p>Student Assistance for HPS Meeting in Sacramento, Ca – EC previously approved travel grants for STC student to travel to the HPS mid-year meeting in Dallas. This funding was deferred to the next HPS meeting in Sacramento because the students were able to locate alternative funding for Dallas. This student travel grant was provided for the summer HPS meeting in Sacramento.</p> <p>Annual STC-HPS Chapter Report to HPS – The annual HPS Chapter Report for the STC was submitted by Jennifer Cerecero.</p>	
President-Elect Report	<p>The July 24, 2012 STC-HPS Breakfast meeting had 22 attendees and it was the first “plated” breakfast (vs. buffet style). Thanks for Ed Bailey for being the Pace® provider. Our National HPS liaison Steven King dropped by during the meeting. Financially, there is an expected loss of \$150-\$200. We have not yet received the bill from national HPS.</p> <p>September 15, 2012 Annual topical meeting on Non-ionizing radiation – Non-ionizing radiation was selected by the program committee chair. Radioactive waste was the only other suggested topic; however, the national mid-year meeting already covered that topic. Twelve speakers are scheduled to present, as well as a visit from the National President-elect, Darrell Fisher. Thanks to Karen Blanchard for securing the logistical details and to Scott Pennington for obtaining several University of Texas speakers.</p> <p>January 12, 2013 Affiliates Fair meeting – this date is relatively firm. San Antonio has been chosen as the venue and we hope to secure a non-hotel venue (a University venue is the first choice, a church venue is back-up). Planning will kick into high gear in October. Working with Jennifer Cerecero, Affiliates co-chair. There are plans for Affiliate door prizes, and there was some discussion if there should be an STC door prize.</p> <p>Annual and Student Meeting – April 20, 2013 is the proposed date and Waco, TX is the proposed location. University of Houston would like to host, but further discussion is necessary.</p> <p>Speaker Policy – Need to develop a policy on reimbursement for speakers at annual topical, student and affiliate fair meetings. The president-elect proposed the following draft policy:</p>	<p>Action Item: Ad-hoc committee to</p>

- Annual topical meeting – suggest waiving registration and lunch fees for non-STC-HPS member speakers. For members, give option of waving or not (i.e. donating).
- Affiliates fair – suggest one waived reservation fee per attending affiliate, potential fees for sponsoring breaks and lunches.
- Student meeting – Suggest no waivers since \$10 fee for students is quite reasonable, plus the added incentive of potential financial rewards.

develop policy on reimbursement for speakers and present at next board meeting.

Will Pate was appointed Ad-Hoc committee chair to discuss these suggestions. This policy discussion was tabled until the next EC meeting, where the ad-hoc committee will present their discussion.

Observations – It is suggested that the policy that the President-elect plan the topical meetings in September be changed, and that the venue and topic be decided prior to the president-elect taking office. Future proposed meetings:

*Action Item:*  
Transfer continuity files to secretary.

- State regulators meeting in 2014.
- North Texas Radiation Preparedness Conference October 2013. This meeting is geared towards the medical industry, police and first responders. STC has been invited by John White to attend.

The continuity files are important to capture lessons learned. An after action report for each officer is suggested. Amanda Sullivan currently has these files. They should be transferred to the new secretary.

The bylaws need some minor revisions to increase flexibility. For example, the requirement to have four meetings per year should be changed to the national standard. The president-elect will circulate his proposed changes for discussion at the next EC meeting.

**Past-President's Report**

No new developments to report.

**Secretary Report**

No report at this time.

**Treasurer Report**

The treasurer presented a written report which was approved by voice vote. The current balance of the science teacher account is \$3,621.00, the current balance of the student scholarship account is \$4,802.99. The current operating account balance is \$27,053.87. The payments listed from the operating account are low because STC has not yet been billed by HPS for the breakfast meeting in Sacramento.
